Henvey Inlet Wind LP ("HIW"), a limited partnership between Pattern Renewable Holdings Canada ULC and Nigig Power Corporation, has commenced planning for the construction of a transmission line with a voltage of up to 500 kilovolts ("kV"). The transmission line will deliver electricity generated from the Henvey Inlet Wind Energy Centre ("HIWEC"), located on the Henvey Inlet First Nation Reserve No. 2, to the Ontario electricity grid. Two potential transmission line routes are currently being considered. The first route extends east from the HIWEC connecting to the existing 500 kV Hydro One Networks Inc. ("HONI") transmission line (approximately 20 kilometres ("km")). The second route follows Highway 69 south to the Parry Sound Transformer Station extending approximately 90 km. Both routes may require the construction of a transformer station or switching station to connect to the HONI line.

The transmission line will undergo a "Category B" Environmental Review as described in the Ministry of the Environment and Climate Change's "Guide to Environmental Assessment Requirements for Electricity Projects" (January 2011). At the end of the Environmental Review, an Environmental Review Report (ERR) will be made available for a 30-day review and comment period. The ERR will include a review of existing conditions, potential effects, mitigation measures and document stakeholders input and consultation activities.

Chief Roy Whitney says the deal not only provides money for individuals but will allow for the development of Tsuu T'ina land for business expansion.

The exact amount of money for each resident has not been released, and is subject to a population count.

Akwesasne men kept armed watch over territory's edge

AKWESASNE - Two escaped murderers were caught and shot dead by Ny state police bringing calm to the Akwesasne community where reports of the escapees were circulating.

At Akswesasne men armed with shotguns and

AR-15s, searched the swamp and thick bush on the edge of the territory Saturday for an escaped murderer who has been on the run from authorities for three weeks.

The camouflage-clad men. known as "Land Defenders," were acting on a tip from the community that a white male had been

spotted entering the woods in an area known as the "Al Capone bootleg trail" because it was used to smuggle booze during the prohibition area.

Roger Jock, who led the four-hour search, said the ongoing manhunt for the escaped inmate was beginning to put people in Akwesasne on edge.

We have been watching Amish dairy farm near the and listening to this unfolding," said Jock. "A lot of people here are on edge.

The second of two convicted murderers who staged a brazen escape three weeks ago from a maximum-security prison in northern New York was shot and captured on an Canadian border on Sunday, two days after his fellow inmate was killed in a confrontation with law enforcement officers, state police said. New York State and U.S. federal authorities had focused their search on an area about 16 kilometres south of Malone, NY., which sits about 40 kilometres south-east of the U.S.side of the Akwesasne Mohawk territory. Akwesasne straddles Canada-U.S. border and is about 120 kilometres west

of Montreal. State and federal authorities established a 35 square-kilometre perimeter around the area they believed still contained David Sweat, one of two men who escaped the Clinton Correctional prison on June, 6. About 1,200 state and federal law enforcement officers are involved in the manhunt.

St. Regis Mohawk police chief Matthew Rourke said in an interview with APTN National News Friday that the hunt for the escaped inmate is still too far away from the community to put his force on alert. They are still a good (40 kilometres) away from where we are, if not farther away," said Rourke. 'We are aware of the situation and we will provide whatever assistance as required."

Jock said he believes Sweat had likely slipped through the police perimeter.

New York State police said last week that investigators believed the escaped men were headed to Canada, lock said he grew concerned the men could end up in Akwesasne and put out a call for eyes on the edge of the territory.

lock also got in touch with Duane Chapman, also known as Dog the Bounty Hunter, who is now in Malone.

Chapman was in sporadic contact with Charles Kader, an Akwesasne journalist, during the day. At one point Chapman texted, "go, go, go" after Kader sent him a photo of lock and his crew searching through the bush.

The search crew waded through swamp and dense brush while swarmed by black flies and mosqui-

Jerry Jock joined the search out of concern for his family.

"It's basically about protecting our people," said Jock, as he sat at the back of a pick-up truck with an AR-15 next to him, "My kids are down the road over there.

Bryan King said he trekked through swamp and bush for the same reason.

"I live up the road too," said King, who carried a shotgun during the search. "We're basically all family,"

Roger Jock said it is up to the men to protect the community and he said words have little meaning without action.

"If we can't protect our people, then we'll let someone else do it," he said, "But I am a strong believer in protecting our own."

Later in the evening, lock received a request to check an area around a large garage at the end of a bush trail. He and a relative, with their semi-automatic long-guns in hand, slowly walked around the building and peered between rusting cars and trucks for any signs of an unwanted visitor.

"The plan is to make sure we don't take any rumours of sightings lightly," said lock, "It's our responsibility." (With TIN files)



Car strikes hydro pole; causes power outage

A portion of the territory was without power on Saturday after a car crashed into a hydro pole on Onondaga Road. Around noon on Saturday, irefighters from two Six Nations fire stations were dispatched to a single vehicle collision at 1575 Onondaga Road. A quick response was made with first arriving crews of Pumper/Rescue One arriving within five minutes of receiving the call. The first arriving crews reported that the collision involved a single vehicle older model car which left the roadway striking a hydro pole causing the hydro pole to break in half. Crews said that as a result of the break in the pole, the hydro lines were down and very close to the car and the ground. Due to the electrical hazard which was present, arriving crews were forced to create a defensive perimeter until the arrival of Hydro One crews.

Ontario won't renew agreement with Confederacy

A spokesperson for the Ontario Ministry of Aboriginal Affairs says it won't renew a communication framework it signed in 2012 with then-Aboriginal Affairs Minister Kathleen Wynne, now the premier of Ontario. with the Haudenosaunee Confederacy Cheifs Council.

Instead the Haudenosaunee Confederacy Chiefs' Council is being told it is welcome to sign a new political accord the province has entered into with elected chiefs in Ontario.

Flavia Mussio, MAA spokesperson, said the communications framework, which expired last year, has "served its purpose." "The purpose of the communications framework was to help build a relationship between the Ministry of Aboriginal Affairs and the Confederacy Chiefs," she said in an email to the Turtle Island News. "The communications framework agreement served its purpose, and now Ontario is taking an inclusive approach to accomplish the

desired outcomes. The Haudenosaunee chiefs are very welcome to join those discussions. The door is open to an inclusive approach."

Mussio did not clarify what she meant by "desired outcomes."

The accord establishes a formal political relationship between the Province of Ontario and elected band

councils.

Ontario says the accord, which has yet to be formally signed, is meant to provide opportunity for "further reconciliation between First Nations and Ontario" and to "discuss topics that are of mutual interest such as resource benefits sharing and the treaty relationship."

"At the heart of the matter is the common desire of Ontario and the Chiefs in Council to make real progress in developing strategic, integrated and responsive policies and initiatives to improve outcomes for First Nations people and create prosperous, healthy and strong communities," said Mussio. "Ontario is committed to continuing to build positive relationships with First Nations and to work together to improve the quality of life in First Nation communities.' On June 17, a number of Ontario band council chiefs agreed to the political ac-

cord. A formal signing ceremony between the Government of Ontario and the Chiefs of Ontario will be held sometime this summer.

The idea for the accord was first proposed by the Chiefs of Ontario.

"The accord recognizes First Nations have an inherent right to self-government and commits the Province and the Chiefs of Ontario to work together on shared priorities that improve the lives of First Nations people," the MAA stated in a press release.

Among the signatories will be newly-elected Ontario Regional Chief Isadore Day, and Premier Kathleen Wynne.

The accord was agreed to inprinciple with the following stipulations:

-First Nations, represented by the Chiefs-in-Assembly and the Government of Ontario, wish to move forward together in a spirit of respectful co-existence and with a view to revitalizing the treaty relationship:

-First Nations exist as selfgoverning Indigenous Nations and Peoples with their own governments, cultures, languages, traditions, customs and territories: -The Ontario provincial Crown's jurisdiction and legal obligations are determined by the Canadian constitutional framework, which includes the common law and treaties entered into between First Nations and the Crown:

-First Nations and Ontario recognize the importance of strong First Nations governments in achieving a better quality of life for First Nations and creating a better future for First Nations children and youth;

-The accord is not intended to impact the interpretation of the rights, legal obligations or jurisdiction of the First Nations or Ontario.

The accord will recognize that First Nations have "an inherent right to self-government and that the relationship between Ontario and the First Nations must be based upon respect for this right."

Under the accord, the signatories will agree to host a meeting, at least twice per year, between the leadership of the COO and the premier. The parties will work to identify and address common priorities and issues, that will include, but are not limited to, the treaty relationship, resource benefits and revenue sharing and jurisdictional matters involving First Nations and Ontario.

"This political accord shows that there is a spirit of openness and a willingness from both our government and First Nations to work together to achieve common goals," said David Zimmer, Ontario Minister of Aborigan Affairs. "Negotiating this accord has been a very positive experience. I look forward to continuing to work with the First Nations in Ontario, guided by this significant agreement."

Isadore Day, Ontario Regional Chief, says "I am pleased that the First Nations and Ontario have renewed their relationship. This accord recognizes that First Nations and Ontario must work together to address the pressing needs of our communities. I look forward to working with Ontario in the spirit of the accord."
