Harnessing the Power of the Wind

The 138 megawatt (MW) facility utilizes 60 Siemens Gamesa 2.3 MW wind turbines to provide safe, affordable, and renewable electricity to power the needs of more than 120,000 Manitobans yearly. The facility's energy output is sold to Manitoba Hydro under a 27-year power purchase agreement.
