SunZia Transmission Construction

Work is well underway and on schedule along SunZia's transmission line across Arizona and New Mexico with over 730 workers on site along the line. As a reminder we are constructing the line in three segments.

Here are some exciting milestones:

- Over 1,500 foundations have been completed
- Over 400 structures have been installed
- 3,500 saguaro cacti and 11,000 agave have been relocated

Most of the earthworks have been completed as well as almost 75% of the foundations, and structures continue to be installed across all three segments. Line stringing activities began in April for segment 1 in Arizona, in May for segment 3, and will begin in June for segment 2 in New Mexico.

Here is the progress on SunZia Transmission so far:

Pad grading - 98% complete

Foundations - 72% complete

Anchors Installed - 71% complete

Structures Assembled - 23% complete

Structures Erected - 19% complete

Stringing - 1% complete
