We are excited to announce that wind turbine deliveries for SunZia Wind have started TODAY! We are pleased to share this important project milestone with you as construction continues to progress on schedule

We received feedback from community members following our initial update. Pattern Energy understands that construction can bring about changes, especially for those living nearby. We are committed to addressing your concerns and communicating about construction activities to keep you updated on the project and help you make informed travel decisions during this time.

What does wind turbine delivery mean for you?

It may mean a disruption to your regular travel route.

- Wind turbine deliveries can take place any time between 7am – 4pm Monday through Friday, and occasionally on Saturday. The number of deliveries and the time of day will vary each week.
- The main delivery route for the wind turbine components is HWY 42, from Willard to Corona. The wind turbine components will travel on oversize delivery vehicles which require special traffic flow precautions and accommodations per the permit issued by New Mexico Department of Transportation.

While wind turbine components are on the road for delivery:

- HWY 42 southbound from Willard to Corona will be one-way, while northbound traffic will be stopped. If you enter HWY 42 between flaggers and a delivery truck is enroute, a pilot car will be present to ensure you can pull safely to the side of the road to let the delivery trucks pass.

The deliveries will be travelling toward a receiving yard near Torrance County Road and then the turbine parts will head off to their location.

Drivers are highly encouraged to use the Highway 54 detour to Encino for northbound travel. Please see the map for more information on traffic flow.
